We're excited to have you join us for our 11th year as we bring you more lights than ever! We saw a big increase in attendance last year with over 8,500 visitors over the three nights! Twenty-three community businesses and organizations along with Event Sound & Lighting join Celebrate Redwood Falls to bring you a fun and unique event in Ramsey Park. The lights come on at 8:30pm to showcase the natural beauty of the woods and trails. We're glad you came to enjoy the show!

What began in 2014 as Founders' Day celebrating the arrival of a small group of settlers establishing the future town of Redwood Falls has evolved into the NightFalls event you're experiencing today. The event evolved to a drive-thru event and expanded to encompass the entire park in 2021. We've added over 100,000 lights this year to make it bigger than ever!

We hope you can help keep NightFalls growing with a donation to light up more of Ramsey Park. In addition to growth, we also replace lights each year—those pesky squirrels, rabbits and deer do some damage and of course, normal wear and tear plays a role too! 


Fairies, dinos, animals, & spooks are sure to be spotted on special trails!



NIGHTFALLS

- · Number of lights used: 419,300
- Miles of trails illuminated: 4
- Number of lighted bridges: 8
- Number of lighted waterfalls: 2
- Number of business & organizations decorating areas: 23
- Number of creatures hidden along the designated trails: Spooks 10+, Animals 24+, Dinos 15+, and Fairies 16+
- Past attendance: 8,500 attendees in 2023 including 1,416 vehicles and 4,474 walkers
- NightFalls began as Founders Day in 2014 during Redwood Falls Sesquicentennial
- The 2014-2019 events were entirely at Ramsey Falls, 2020 had 4 drive-thru displays installed by Celebrate Redwood Falls and a Home Edition contest, 2021 expanded drive-thru displays with 21 groups participating and lighting on some trails, 2022 had 22 groups & all trails lighted to include the entire park, and 2023 increased to 26 groups.
- Future goals for the event: Add more lighting along trails by decorating trees and ground areas, increase local participation, and bring more tourism to Redwood Falls



FUN FACTS

RAMSEY PARK

 Ramsey Park is 256+ acres which makes it the largest municipal park in the state

 The unique swayback bridge built in 1938 is on the National Register of Historic Places

 Home to 2 waterways - Redwood River which creates the Falls of the Redwood and Ramsey Creek which creates Ramsey Falls

• 5 Bridges cross Ramsey Creek and 2 cross the Redwood River




